

Thoroughbred Racing. In the Woodbine Oaks, the first race of Canada's Triple Tiara for three-year-old Canadian-bred fillies, Milwaukee Appeal captured the win by 3-3/4 lengths under jockey Stewart Elliott. Trainer Scott Fairlie trained and raced Milwaukee Appeal on Phase 3 manufactured by **KER Team Member Brooks Performance Horse Feeds**. Milwaukee Appeal entered the race as the leading money winner in the field, having won four of her eight career starts. The victory boosted her lifetime earnings to almost \$650,000 (US).

Eventing. World-class three-day event rider Mike Ryan won the leading rider title at the Tattersalls International Horse Trials. Mike, who is sponsored by **KER Team Member Bluegrass Horse Feeds**, won the one-star event, placed second in the three-star event, and claimed third place in the two-star event. The three-star event, which was the FEI World Cup qualifying competition, was won by Patricia Ryan, Mike's wife, riding Fernhill Clover Mist. The Ryans, long-time clients of **Bluegrass Horse Feeds**, use Transform Cubes and Equi-Jewel as part of their regular feeding program. Both are members of the senior Horse Sport Ireland team, which benefits from nutritional consultation from **Bluegrass Horse Feeds** and **KER**.

Megan Jones continued her incredible record of three-star eventing wins by topping the Melbourne International Three-Day Event. Jones and Kirby Park Allofasudden showed their consistency in the dressage phase, ending the day less than one point behind the leader. The young chestnut gelding showed his maturity and experience with a penalty-free cross-country round that was sufficient to hold the team in second place. Jones rode the show-jumping

phase with great conviction and once again chalked up a clear round to clinch the victory. This year marks the third time Jones, who is sponsored by **Kentucky Equine Research**, has won the event. Jones also put in a strong fourth-place performance on Westbury Park Irish Grove in the CCI* from a field of 67 competitors.

Thoroughbred Training. Winning a race or two here and there won't do it. To earn the title of Leading Trainer, as Nick Gonzalez did at Woodbine Racetrack in Toronto, Ontario, Canada, a person must consistently produce horses that are at the peak of fitness and condition. Gonzalez, a customer of **KER Team Member Brooks Performance Feeds**, said, "We're feeding 65 horses a day at Woodbine and Fort Erie. This is our fourth year using the feed and since starting on the feed, we have been doing good over that span, and even better each year. We're going to stay on the feed. Driving. Chester Weber won the FEI Horse Teams division of the CAI-A Live Oak Invitational in Ocala, Florida. With a score almost 40 points better than the second-place competitor, Weber and his four-horse team topped the list of twelve entries from four countries.
